Dear Citizens,

With the overwhelming number of comments and misinformation published on social media in the last few weeks, I invite you to contact the office if you have questions. Accurate information must be obtained, and people should not rely on unofficial sources on social media. I have always been and will always be there for my citizens. Please remember that you know me and my values, unlike random people I have never met making TikTok videos.

Please note that I am the Mayor of Grosse-Ile, and I have a local Municipal Council that is responsible for local municipal matters. As the Mayor of Grosse-Ile, I also sit at the Maritime Community table, where regional matters are decided. Along with my elected colleagues from the other island villages, I have one vote out of seven at the regional level. Therefore, although Grosse-Ile is an independent municipality, we do not have more decisional power at the regional level than the other villages of the Islands, like Grande-Entry or Amherst.

During the public meeting for Maritime Community on April 8, 2024, I did vote in favour of the Passe Archipel because I support the idea of funds being collected to help off-set the cost of extra garbage amassed during the tourist season. This does not mean that I am in favour or that I voted for the Regional Park. I am currently in discussions with the Maritime Community on how to best bring more information to the community concerning the Regional Park project, as the park is not yet officially created.

I thank you all for your continued support and I sincerely hope that you will join us at our public meetings held each second Monday of the month. Please find the 2024 calendar of the regular sittings below. The Council schedule is always available online at mungi.ca and we post the agenda in our townhall entrance and at Carla's Grocery.
